Helping our Ukrainian Friends

Just a little over a month ago Ann Schwarm reminded our congregation of our ongoing support and the continued need of Zoryana's family (Victoria, Oleg and family).

This season, as we reflect on and continue the gift of generosity we are reminded of the ongoing story of Victoria, Oleg, and their three children—Ukrainian refugees who found safety in the U.S. through the Uniting for Ukraine Program. With our support and that of John Calvin Presbyterian Church, they've spent the last year acclimating to life in the St. Louis area. Despite challenges, they are thriving: the children love school, and both parents are employed. However, they face new hurdles as financial support from their initial sponsors has ended, leaving them worried about meeting basic needs.

Victoria's recent words resonate deeply: "I am scared for the future of my family here and for my loved ones in Ukraine." In response, I ask two things of you:

1. Pray for peace—that the war ends and lives on both sides are spared.

2. Give generously to our Ukrainian Refugee Fund, ensuring this family can continue to build a stable life here. Share the story. Maybe you can't give or can't give any more. Maybe someone you know is waiting

for this opportunity. No gift is too small. As in the story of the man saving starfish, every
